What is Squash Haven? Our model is based on a multi-faceted approach to youth development.

Squash Haven's Strategy

Year-Round Intense Squash Instruction

Students receive 3 to 4 hours of squash instruction from our highly qualified coaching staff each week and Yale's varsity squash teams.
Students also compete in matches and tournaments.

Individual Tutoring and Placement

Students receive 3 to 4 hours of individualized academic time per week with staff and volunteer tutors. Struggling students also attend supplemental tutoring and study hall sessions.

Group Academic Enrichment

Students work together in homework help and academic enrichment sessions, which are designed to supplement school work by providing skills most requisite for success at the college level.

Community Service

All team members complete ten hours of community service per year. Service reinforces teamwork and character values.
